Introduction

Kampur College Profile

Kampur College of Nagaon district is a propitious institution offering Arts courses under Gauhati University for degree programme. The college is situated in Kampur town, the southern part of Nagaon District, with the river Kapili flowing nearby. Kampur is located at 26.20°N 92.63°E and it has a population of 2,23,815 (Census Report, 2013). According to Census of India, 2011 report the literary rate of Kampur town is 88.28%, which is higher than state average of 72.19%. Kampur College has played a major role behind this significant percentage of high literary rate of Kampur and the nearby area. This college is at a distance of 30 Km from Nagaon bypass of the East West Corridor and is well connected by routes. The nearest railway station to this college is Kampur station, which lies at a distance of less than one kilometre.

In the early sixties, a group of post graduates from Kampur area dreamt of a college in Kampur. These youths, namely Hira Barthakur, Sabharam Mazumdar, Gahit Chandra Saikia, Soru Ram Laskar, Juga Bora and Magu Bordoloi discussed about this with their friends and teachers residing in the hostel of Kampur H.S. & M.P. School. These teachers including Sri Chittaranjan Sarmah Roy, Netrahash Goswami, Bilin Dutta and Uma Kalita not only welcomed the youths' admirable endeavor but also promised to support them in attainting their target.

In their quest for a mentor the public-spirited youths fortunately found the most valuable guidance from the then principal of ADP College late Md. Abdul Hye. According to his esteemed suggestion, a coaching class consisting of female students was started from July, 1967, with an arrangement that they would appear in P.U. Final Examination of 1968 through ADP College, Nagaon. Meanwhile, a committee to supervise the functioning of the coaching classes was formed with Sri Juga Prasad Bora and Sri Hira Barthakur as the president and secretary respectively while Sri Rudra Borah, Upen Bayan, Saruram Laskar, Magu Bardoloi, Kalyan Chakraborty, Chittaranjan Sarmah Roy, Bishwa Borah, Gahit Chandra Saikia, Sabharam Mazumdar and Uma Kalita as its members.

The commencement of the coaching classes was the crucial juncture leading to all subsequent activities taking place in quick succession. Those in management were constantly at work trying to fulfil pre- conditions that would pave the way for the college to be born. To the satisfaction of all concerned, the Executive Council of Gauhati University accorded the much awaited permission to start the formal college with Pre-University (Arts) Classes from the session 1968-69 and with this Kampur College came into existence.

After getting the permission from the university, the coaching classes ceased to exist and regular P.U. classes for the session 1968-69 were held in Swaraj Bhavan, a public hall at the heart of the town. Sri Krishnananda Sarmah Barua, M.A. (English) was appointed the principal on 15th July, 1968 and he remained in that post till his retirement on 28th February, 1996. The tireless efforts of the Managing Committee was paid back well when the college was allotted 40 bighas of land out of the grazing reserve lying to the west of Kampur. Immediately after that, the foundation stone of the college building was laid on 20th March 1969 by Dev Kanta Baruah, the then Oil Chairman.

To construct the college building on its allotted land a massive fund collection drive was undertaken during 1969-70 in Kampur and its nearby areas. In an unprecedented way, the local people responded spontaneously with their contributions to the collection campaign. With the money thus collected, the Building Construction Committee, under the guidance of the Secretary of the committee Sri Lakheswar Gohain undertook construction works very soon. Eventually, a tin-roofed concrete institution emerged on the college land and the classes were shifted to it in the beginning of the new session of 1970. Then in 1973, the Managing Committee was replaced by College Governing Body, constituted by the govt. of Assam. The president of the first GB was Punaram Borah and Jageswar Borah was its secretary. As there was no govt. grant forthcoming, the fund position had to be revitalized from time to time with the donation and fund collected through the theatre and cinema shows organised in aid of the college. Still, the sources to meet various requirements remained limited. In the meantime, the college was granted affiliation up to BA 1st year in 1975. Another important occurrence took place in July 1976 when the college received an ad-hoc grant of Rs. 1000 per month and it was enhanced to Rs. 3000 in 1977. However, after eleven long years, all heaved a sigh of relief when in July 1979 the college was brought under deficit grant-in-aid system.

Kampur College has already completed 49 years of its existence and, within this period the College has made relatively slow but noticeable progress. At present, the college imparts undergraduate level of education with facilities for Major courses in Assamese, Economics,

Education, English, Geography, History and Political Science. The college has been assessed and accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with C++ Grade in 2005. The college has been registered under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act.

The college is well equipped with modern infrastructural facilities and well-endowed with an excellent and dedicated faculty to cater to the needs and aspirations of the students to meet the challenges of the present day competitive world. There exists an atmosphere of cordial relationship between the students and teachers in the college. Apart from academic pursuits, stress is also put on co-curricular activities and all round development of the students' personality. Special attention is paid to the students coming from backward and marginalised sections of society whose welfare was on the top of the agenda when the college was established.

Kampur College has certainly grown in stature over the years and is counted as one of the leading co-educational institutions of Nagaon district. Since its establishment, the college has come a long way in meeting the emerging needs and challenges of the present day scenario.

Points to be noted

- According to the latest Gauhati University guidelines, a student opting Major in language (other than the classics) is not allowed to take MIL/Alternative English in the same language.
- Education and Geography are subjects with practical. A student cannot select two subjects having practical.
- Applicants are required to select the combination of subjects carefully as there is no provision of changing subjects after the completion of his/her admission procedure.

Number of Seats per Subject

Number of seats including both Major and General Courses under various Departments is 500. However, for Major course there are limited number of seats available, which are shown in the table below,

Points to be noted:

- Meritorious and deserving candidates can opt for Major course.
- Admission to Major Course is subject to a student's performance in a written test conducted by the respective department as per schedule, to be notified at the time of admission.
- On specific ground, students from science stream would be admitted in major course.

Admission and Fee Structure

Admission to TDC course is open to the applicants who have passed the higher secondary examination in Arts under AHSEC or any other equivalent examination recognized by Gauhati University.

Admission Procedure

- Application for admission into the college should be made in prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of requisite fee.
- The dates of admission to various courses will be notified in the college notice board.
- Admission to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rules.
- The following testimonials are to be attached with the application form and the original certificates are to be produced at the time of admission,
 - i. Admit card, marks sheet and pass certificate of the last examination passed.
 - ii. HSLC certificate and admit card.
 - iii. Registration card of AHSEC
 - iv. **Two** passport size photographs of the applicant
 - v. Gap certificate where necessary
 - vi. Caste certificate where necessary
- The decision of the College authority regarding all admissions is final. The College authority reserves the right to refuse admission to any one without citing any reason.
- Admission to any course of the college may be cancelled at any time if the information furnished by the applicant at the time of admission is found to be incorrect.
- THE COLLEGE ADMISSION WILL BE BASED ON MERIT
- NO CHANGE IN COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER THE ADMISSION PROCESS IS OVER.

Reservation

Seats for SC, ST and OBC students are reserved as per govt rules. In this respect caste certificate issued by the competent authority under Government of Assam only will be valid.

Note: According to the new regulation of Semester Courses, students will have to get themselves admitted to the next semester irrespective of their result (eg. Even if a student has failed in the Semester I examination, he/she would be allowed to get himself/herself admitted into semester II.

Fee (For Session 2017-2018)

The rate of fees will be given at the time of admission based on revised guideline of the Education Department, Govt. of Assam.

General Information

Classes for newly admitted students of BA 1st semester for the session 2017-18 will start on and from 1st August 2017.

The college class hours are from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm.

(A) Rules and Regulations of the College

(i) College Rule and Discipline

In our college emphasis is laid on discipline and character building. Students are required to maintain high standard of discipline in and outside of the college campus. They are also expected to obey rules and regulations of the college prescribed by the college authority. Violation of rules and regulations and committing of any offence which will jeopardize the interest and smooth administration of the college will lead to disciplinary action like termination of scholarship and expulsion from the college. In this regard the decision of the Principal is binding and final.

- ❖ The college premise is a MOBILE FREE ZONE for students. Any student found using mobile inside college premises will have to face necessary action.
- ❖ The college premise is a NO SMOKING ZONE. Smoking and any other kind of intoxicants including panmachala, gutkha and spitting in the classrooms are strictly prohibited.
- Gossiping and loitering either in the verandahs or in the class rooms are strictly prohibited when classes or examinations are going on.
- ❖ When there is no class, students are to develop a habit of reading newspapers, journals, magazines etc. in the reading room of the library.
- Property of the college is the property of all. Damage of any property will lead to severe punishment
- Pleasant and cordial atmosphere should be maintained inside the college campus.

- ❖ Irregularities, misbehaviour, violence of any kind and disobedience towards the teachers or authority by any students are punishable.
- College uniform is compulsory for all students
- ❖ 75% class attendance is mandatory to appear in the final examinations.

(ii) Undertaking by the Parent/ guardian

The parent/ guardian of the student will have to give an undertaking in the prescribed form at the time of submission of admission form in the college to the effect that his/her ward will maintain discipline and decorum of the college. In this form itself the parent/guardian will also have to give an undertaking mentioning their annual income.

(iii) Students' Class Attendance

The college takes students' class attendance into account for the purpose of allowing students for appearing in the Semester system, receiving academic awards and scholarships, participating in the students' union election etc. The college has the following rules in this regard,

- A student whose attendance is more than 65% and less than 75% will have to pay Non-collegiate fees to appear in any final examination conducted by GU.
- ➤ A student whose attendance is found to be less than 65% will be considered as Dis-collegiate and such student will be debarred from appearing in any final examination conducted by GU.
- Continued absence of 25 days in class is enough to prohibit the concerned students from attending classes.
- > Scholarship holders with less than 75% of attendance will have to return the entire amount to the concerned authority.
- > Students who remain absent to represent college in NCC, NSS and extracurricular activities in University/State/National/International

level meets will have to compensate his/her loss through extra classes and Sessional Examination with the consent of the respective teachers.

(iv) College Uniform

College Uniform is compulsory for all students. No student is permitted to wear any dress other than the college uniform in the college premises.

Boys: white shirt, black coloured trouser

Girls: Muga or Muga coloured mekhela, white chaddar with blue border and blue blouse/white coloured Salwar kamij with blue coloured churni. Leggings are strictly prohibited.

Sweater: In winter, black sweater for boys and black Cardigan for girls.

COLLEGE UNIFORM IS COMPULSORY FOR ALL STUDENTS AND NO OTHER DRESS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE COLLEGE PREMISES.

(v) Identity card

The college authority issues an identity card at the time of admission to every student. This card is non-transferable. It contains vital information about the holder viz, name, semester, class, roll no and a passport size photograph duly attested and signed by the principal. It is mandatory for a student to keep the identity card during his/her college hours.

(vi) Teacher- Guardian meet

The teacher guardian meetings are held regularly in the college according to the convenience of the college authority.

(B) Facilities Provided in the College

(i) College library and reading room

The college has a well organized library with a good stock of text books, reference books and other recreational books. A large number of journals, magazines and periodicals including Newspapers are also stocked in the library. After admission students are provided with library cards to issue books. Students are issued two books for pass course and four books for major courses. Borrowers must return the books within fifteen days from the date of issue of the books. An overdue of charge of Rs 1/- per book per day, will be levied if the book is not returned on or before the due date. However, there is provision of re-issue and reservation of books. A borrower will be responsible for the loss or damage of any book borrowed from the college library.

(ii) Scholarship

- ❖ There is provision of scholarship for OBC/SC/ST/Minority Students.
- ❖ There is provision for the UGC scholarship for the meritorious students.
 - (a) For UGC scholarship (for general category) APL/BPL certificate has to be produced
 - (b) For OBC/MOBC (non-creamy layer) SC/ST category- caste certificate has to be produced.

The above scholarships are granted by the Government for which application forms of eligible students are forwarded to the respective authorities for consideration.

(iii) Girls' common room

The college has a girls' common room with hygienic drinking water and toilet facilities.

(iv) Boys' common room

Kampur College also has a spacious boys' common room.

(v) College canteen

The college has a canteen which provides food to the students, faculty and employees of the college at a reasonable price.

(vi) Xerox facility to the students

The College provides Xerox facility to the students at cheaper rate.

(vii) Indoor stadium

The college provides facilities for outdoor and indoor games. There is a well- equipped indoor stadium and gymnasium in the college campus.

(viii) Career counselling and guidance cell

The college has a career counselling and guidance cell which was formed to infuse a sense of career consciousness among the students in this world of cut-throat competition. The cell organises workshops and various activities to promote employability and inculcate **life skills** among students.

(ix) Remedial coaching centre

The SC/ST/OBC and minority students can avail the remedial classes as per the UGC scheme.

(x) Youth festival

Students participate regularly in the youth festival organised by GU and different inter college competitions every year.

(xi) Distance Education

(C) Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Activities:

In addition to the prescribed course of study the college encourages the students to organize and participate effectively in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities such as games and sports, literary and cultural activities, debating, symposium etc from time to time.

(i) Games and sports

Facilities for games like football, volleyball, cricket, badminton, table tennis, carom, chess etc are available in the college.

(ii) NCC

The college has a dynamic NCC wing, with a strength of 50 cadets which functions under 8 Assam BN NCC. The cadets have represented the North Eastern Region in different national level camps including Republic Day Parade and other NCC activities. A number of cadets after obtaining 'B' and 'C' certificates have been recruited into Para-Military Forces, State Police Service and different administrative service posts. Besides Personality Development and Adventure programmes, the NCC cadets are also trained in Map reading and 7.62 mm SLR Carbine Machine Gun firing. The cadets are committed to Community Development and other issues of public concerns. Some of the activities carried out by NCC wing are Disaster Management, Campus Cleaning, Tree Plantation, Yoga camps etc.

(ii) Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) that monitors the overall quality aspects of the college. The IQAC takes initiatives in conducting various programmes to benefit the students, teachers and the community as a whole.

(iii) Grievance Redressal Cell
